# Dear Friends,

On Pentecost 2017, Archbishop Vigneron issued his pastoral Letter Unleash the Gospel as a follow-up to the archdiocesan synod of 2016 that included representatives from all parishes. We studied that document at our parish council and commission meetings throughout 2017-18 and I issued a pastoral letter *Ignite the Gospel* in September 2018. Both letters have guided the efforts of the archdiocese and our own parish. Now the archdiocese has begun the second phase of this "unleashing" process called "Sent on Mission." This phase will focus on 1) the development of a Missionary Strategic Plan [MSP] and 2) our participation in a capital campaign to provide the funds for our missionary efforts. The MSP will be developed by a visioning leadership team representing the staff, parish council and other parish members. It will offer our highest "dreams" for the future of parish ministries. I expect this process to take place in early 2020 and the fundraising to occur next fall. But I haven't received confirmation of that timeline, so wait for details as they develop. It is my hope and prayer that as we approach our parish's 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary next June, we will be able to have clear 20/20 vision for the bright future that lies ahead. I look forward to your involvement.

In the process we are transformed. Jesus asks us to offer gestures of kindness, patience, and nearness to anyone in need. These gestures of outreach and service to those in need fill the heart with joy and offer consolation.

We teamed up with the Riverview Knights of Columbus for the Petition Drive to End Dismemberment Abortion and received over 420 signatures.

In efforts to Care for God's Creation, we offered ecofriendly bags to reduce the use of plastic. We installed a chilled, filtered water station in the Social Hall to eliminate the need for bottled water. We also purchased eco-friendly water bottles made from recycled plastic for use with the new drinking fountain. Every little bit helps! If you are interested in purchasing more ecofriendly bags, please come to the parish office.

Recent Christian Service events were the Life Chain and Flu shots. Our vicariate Mercy in Action service will be the weekend of October 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. We are collecting supplies for our local animal shelters and offering a Red Cross Blood Drive. Our Christian Service Commission along with our Blood Drive coordinators


will be overseeing this service.

The Thanksgiving pantry distribution will be November 20<sup>th</sup>. Our pantry clients will be receiving Thanksgiving meals to take home to their families. The Giving Tree Project prep will begin soon. Our Christmas pantry distribution will be December 18<sup>th</sup>. I look forward to sharing in these events with you. Not only are we serving those in need together but we are a supportive community.

This fall season we began a new bible study, Jesus Revealed: Encountering Christ In His Biblical Names, providing people with a wonderful opportunity to deepen their



relationship with Jesus Christ through the study of Scripture, Church teachings, the Catechism and from the lives of the saints. This enriching program was offered in the

evening, in response to many parishioner requests, and allowed many new people to participate. This bible study featured personal study, small group discussion and teaching videos to aid the participants to mature and develop in their discipleship with Christ. We will study the first nine names of Jesus this fall and then study the remaining nine names in early 2020.

In addition, our parish will be offering Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire series The Pivotal Players Volume 1 this fall. We will feature three of the players once a month: October 16 was St. Francis of Assisi, then St. Thomas Aquinas on November 29 and concluding with G.K. Chesterton on December 18. The remaining three players will be featured in early 2020. This engaging and dynamic series illumines a handful of

saints, artists, mystics and scholars who not only shaped the life of the Church but changed the course of civilization. Through this series

the activities kicking back into gear, we are off to a good start.

This year St. Cyprian Church has seen great stability in the music department. I am always encouraging new people to come and join us. If you play an instrument or have a love of singing, please consider sharing your talent by joining the choir or playing an instrument at one of our weekend Masses.

We are looking to fill one last position in the handbell ensemble this year. If you can read music and have background in playing an instrument, please consider trying out for this ministry. This wonderful group will be ringing at our All Soul's Mass of Remembrance, Advent & Christmas Season Masses, and a few weekend Masses in between.

The Liturgical Choir is our primary vocal choir for the parish that consists of 25 to 30 members. We are always looking for more people to join us! Anyone, high school age or older, is welcome and encouraged to join. Reading music is NOT a requirement, although a love of music is (and a sense of humor helps!) We rehearse weekly on Wednesday evenings at 7pm. The Liturgical Choir is regularly scheduled to sing at the 11am Mass on Sundays, but we sometimes sing at other Masses throughout the year. This year we have started early on our Christmas Music and are looking forward to adding a beautiful sound to Worship.



The instrumental ensemble we have at the 9am Mass continues to flourish. Consisting of two or three guitars, violin, flute, piano and percussion, these well-polished musicians contribute to waking everyone up with songs of praise at the early Sunday morning Mass! If you are looking for a good wake up call, consider joining us for the 9am Mass on Sundays. It's worth waking up early, I promise!

Our Resurrection Choir has continued to enhance the funeral liturgies. We also encourage instrumentalists to accompany us as well. This ministry is also a corporal work of mercy — to bury the dead.

We have begun our Worship Commission meetings for the year and are working on many different events. We had our annual Liturgical Ministers Day, which was a great success and now are preparing for All Souls' Mass of Remembrance on November 2<sup>nd</sup> at 10:00am. This Liturgy will be in Remembrance of all who have gone before us this past year. This Advent season we will offer a day of Eucharistic Adoration on December 15<sup>th</sup> with praise & worship music at 5pm. Come and spend some time in private prayer as we await the coming of our Lord.

Aside from enhancing Liturgical Ministries, the Worship Commission oversees the Art & environment of the church. They have continued to help brighten up the atmosphere with plants, candles and decorations appropriate to the Liturgical Seasons. How boring would life be if we were all exactly the same? God appreciates variety so he created us to be unique. We are like the leaves in that we are all different sizes, shapes and colors.

So, I say WELCOME FALL and all of its beauty.



The Religious Formation classes are in full swing. It is so wonderful to hear the sound of children enjoying one another as they learn about and share their faith with each other. We use the RCL Benziger program Be My Disciples as we follow the curriculum developed by the Archdiocese of Detroit. Lessons are taught to the student as a whole person so they will Encounter, Grow and Witness their faith at each level of learning. Our goal is to help form people who love and serve the Lord for their whole lives.

Our program has many options for families to fulfill their formation requirements.

Students in Grades 1-5 have the choice of attending the Monday evening classes from 6:15-7:30pm. The children will be in a classroom with children of their grade level and

a catechist. **OR** They can attend the Family Program where the families meet together monthly. One lesson a month is geared toward the children and parents separately with a few family lessons intertwined throughout the program. The other lessons are taught at home with the parents as the primary catechists.

The Middle School Program is unique, grades 6-8 meet in sessions over a period of time. Each student must complete 3 sessions to move to the next level the following year. This program was designed to accommodate the busyness of the Middle School student.

Our Sacrament Program which includes Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation are taught outside of the above programs. The sacraments are taught separately to ensure that the student will be able to gain the most out of each class. This will also accommodate those who enter the program at different levels.

I would like to Welcome Back our returning catechists along with a couple of new ones. I am so happy you have chosen to share your faith with the children.



As of September 30, the parish finances are in excellent shape. Stewardship is above budget, CSA is over our target, and lease income is allowing the parish to move forward with improvements around the complex.

Summer is always a busy time for maintenance. We take advantage of less frequent activities and good weather to make repairs and upgrades. Our outstanding maintenance team of Matt Ray, Daryl Bartl, Henry Preston and Mike Kirch have been busy trimming trees, pulling weeds, fixing the garage, etc. in addition to major projects. We installed a new chilled/filtered water station in the Social Hall which has enabled us to stop purchasing plastic water bottles and purchased reusable water bottles made from recycled plastic. We upgraded light fixtures around the parking lot and entrances with LED fixtures to improve efficiency and provide brighter lights. We also installed a glass block wall at the front of the Parish Office entrance. This will reduce gusts of wind blowing into the office all winter—and it looks great, too! We are in the process of redecorating the restrooms in the Social Hall. About 75% of the tile work is complete, with new stalls, toilets and sinks coming soon. The chairs in the church are being reupholstered, and the kneelers are next. Many of these upgrades are long overdue, and have been made possible due to our lease with Riverview Schools.

Although the season is not quite over, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our WONDERFUL Volunteer Grass Cutting group: Chuck Thomas, Alan Nowak, Juan Lucaire, Mark Lauer, Jeff Goga and Dennis Belack. We appreciate your dedication and hard work!
